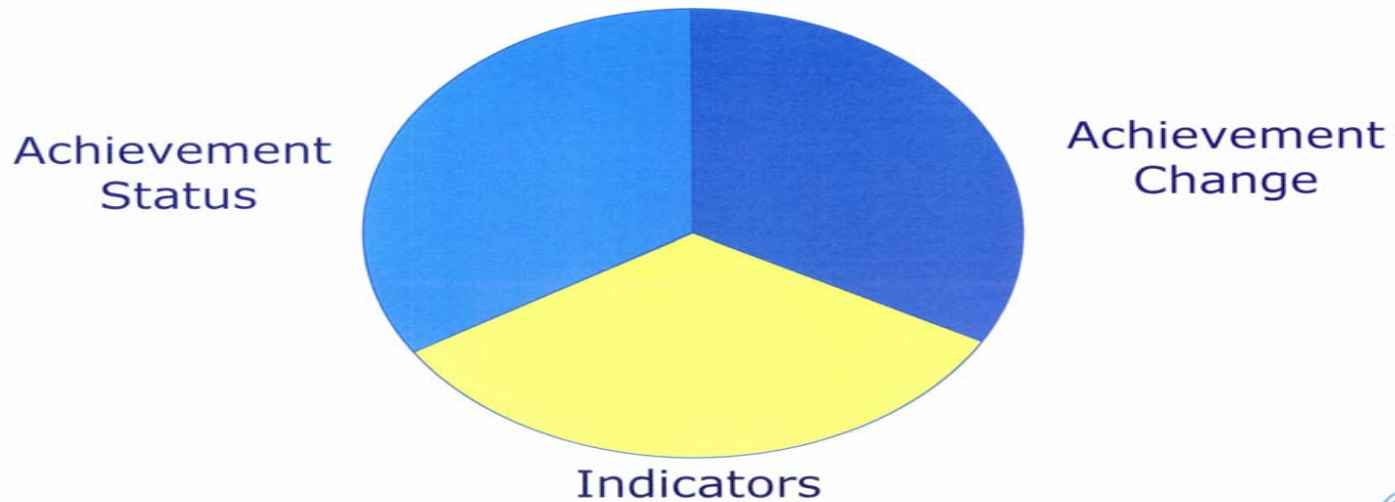

**Achievement Status:** is calculated for all schools where at least 30 students have valid MME scores in the content area at that grade range.

**Achievement Change:** A prediction has been made for each content area and grade level that was tested in previous years. The prediction is compared to the school's actual 2007-08 percent proficient. The school's achievement status score in each content area is adjusted based on whether the school exceeds or does not meet the prediction.

# Michigan Merit Exam

- Combination of several different tests:
  - ACT: college entrance examination
  - WorkKeys: job skills assessments in reading and mathematics
  - Michigan Curriculum: mathematics, science, social studies, and persuasive writing

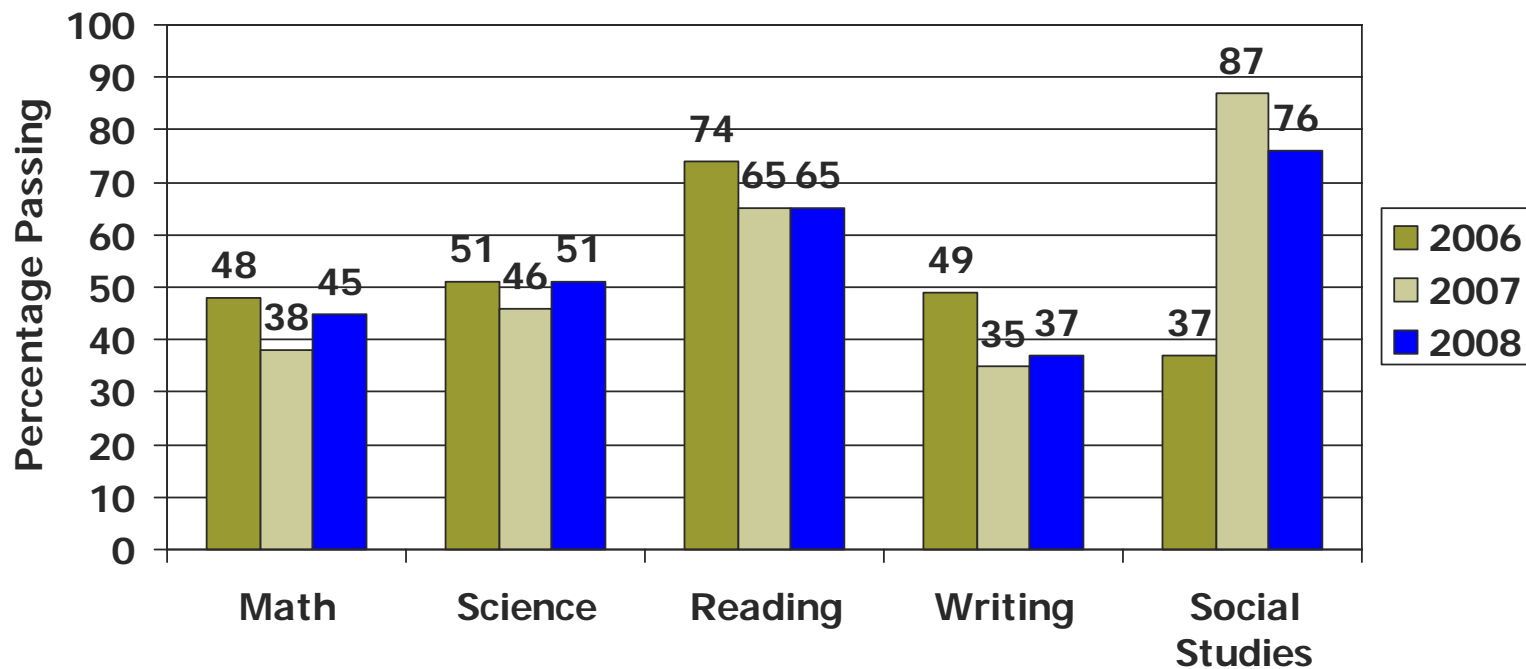

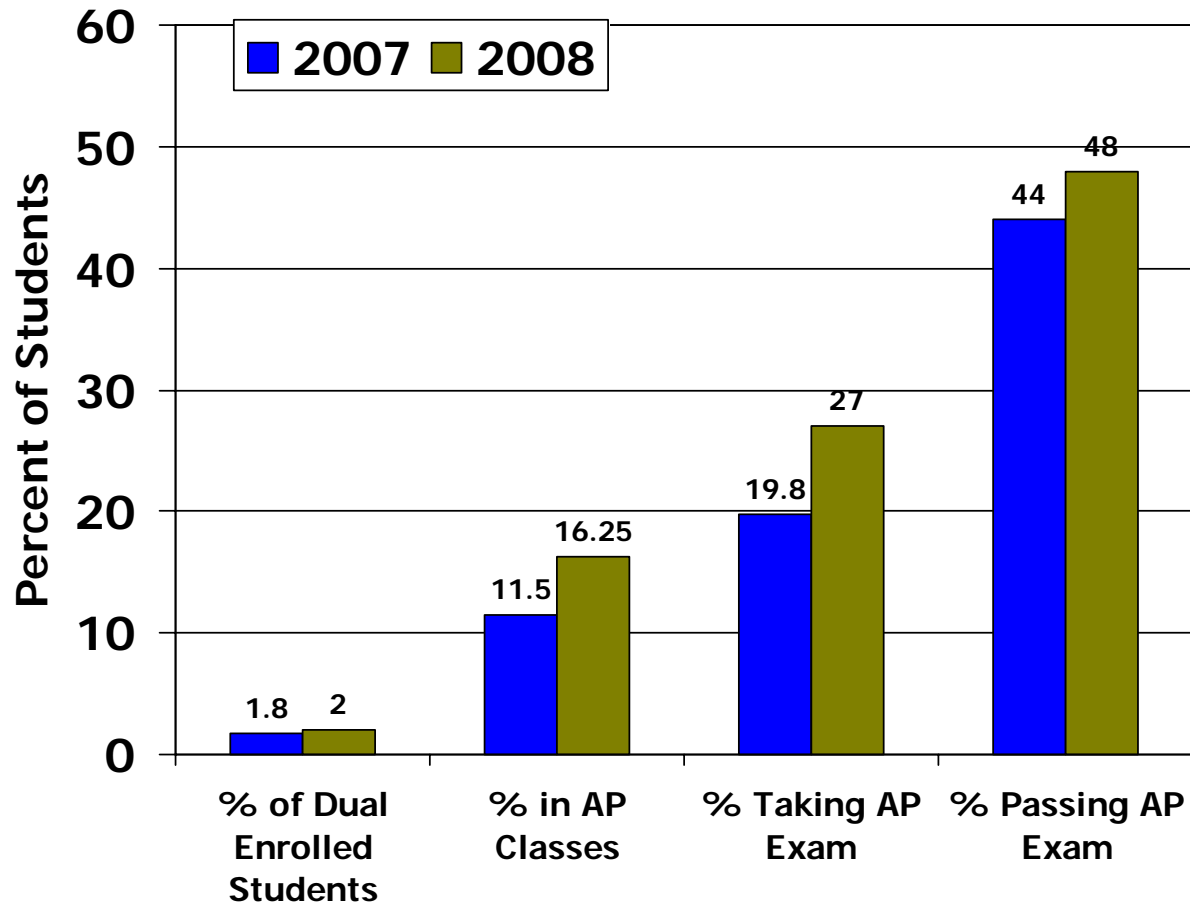

- Based on the following:
  - MME (Michigan Merit Exam) scores
  - Number of students that participate in assessments
  - Target area goals projected by state

# Adequate Yearly Progress

## Adequate Yearly Progress

- **Participation - 95% tested**
  - MEAP or MI-Access
- **Achievement - Proficiency**
  - Meet state objective or “safe harbor” target for improvement
  - Participation and Proficiency
    - Must meet in both Math and English Language Arts
    - Must meet for whole school and subgroups
- **Additional Academic Indicator**
  - Graduation Rate – 80% - high schools
  - Attendance – 85% - elementary and middle schools

**Note:** 95% participation includes ACT, WorkKeys, MME by **all** students per test / subject area

# [ Public Act-25 (MCL 380.373) ]

- The requirement for every school district in the state to issue an annual report has existed since 1990.
